

Flower Show Rules, Entry Tags, Tips and Scoring

RULES

General Rules

1. Competitions are open to members only.
2. All entries must be created by the member and grown in the exhibitor's own garden unless otherwise stated.
3. Exhibitors must furnish their own containers and ensure that each has an entry tag complete with their name.
4. The decision of the judge(s) shall be final. All complaints must be given to the show committee in writing.

Horticultural

1. Exhibitors may exhibit a maximum of 3 entries in each class.
2. When number of blooms, sprays, etc. are stated, they must be adhered to otherwise the entry will be disregarded. A bud showing colour is counted as a bloom.
3. Potted plants may be shown only once a year and must be owned by the exhibitor for at least 3 months prior to showing.

Design and Crafts

1. Design and crafts must be made by the exhibitor. Purchased materials are allowed.

Photography

1. Participants may enter 1 photograph in each class.
2. Photographs should be unmounted and at least 5 inches by 7 inches in size.
3. Entries may be coloured or black and white.
4. Photographs should not be altered or photoshopped.
5. Please print your name and contact information on the back of each submission.
6. Photos must have a horticultural topic.

ENTRY TAGS

Entry tags are made available at the meetings before each show and, of course, at the shows. Complete the tag as described in the Yearbook, fold it at the perforation and place it under your plant.

TIPS

Condition Flowers Beforehand

- Take a pail of lukewarm water to the garden.
- Cut plant material in the early morning or late evening.
- Immerse flowers immediately in water.
- Leave overnight in a draft-free area such as a garage or basement.
- Use Flora Keep if you wish, or a little cornstarch for tulips.

Preparing a Violet for Show

- Put in a dark room 36 to 48 hours before show time. Darkness preserves the freshness of older blooms. Flowers become larger and more buds open.

SCORING SYSTEM (Any flowers – lilies as an example)

Condition: 30 points

- Includes stage of maturity
- Lower flowers should be open, upper ones in bud
- No faded flowers

Vigour: 20 points

- Length and strength of stem
- Size of flowers
- Attractiveness of foliage

Placement on stem: 20 points

- No crowding; flowers should not interfere with each other

Substance: 10 points

- Thickness of petals, firmness

Form: 10 points

- Typical of species or cultivar
- Broad petals preferred

Colour: 10 points

- Should be clear, bright and characteristic of the species or cultivar

TOTAL POINTS: 100 (PERFECT SCORE)
